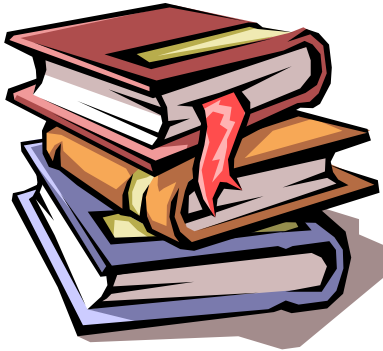

What can the librarian do for teachers?

- provide library orientation for your students
- collaborate on design and/or implementation of research projects
- collaborate with you / teach your students to:
 - Use research process (Big 6 or other)
 - Create bibliographies / cite resources
 - Determine best materials
 - Use online resources/databases
 - Integrate technology
 - Search the Internet effectively & efficiently
 - Avoid plagiarism
 - Take notes
 - Identify genres
 - Make / edit films
 - Evaluate websites
- pull materials (carts of books, etc) for units
- create *list of websites* (or other resources) for units
 - list available to students via 3fireslibrary website
- gather periodical articles to supplement a class topic
- support Reading Apprenticeship including:
 - lexile level information
 - matching students to books
 - locating informational articles for student reading
- check out videos, books, or periodicals
- assist you in locating, pricing, and ordering books / materials
- purchase library materials to support your curriculum
- find special items
- support use of UnitedStreaming (Discovery Education Streaming)
- support use/provide training for use of *online resources*
- support AV equipment
- provide channel for multi-class viewing of video/DVD
- laminate
